During the week prior to Field Day, the club sponsored its first Tuesday night regular meeting, moving it from the third Friday of the month to the third Tuesday of the month. It turned out to be a great success, with 21 people in attendance. The meeting was short, but the final preparations regarding Field day were spelled out, with **Andrew - KG5SKM**, taking the reins as the events coordinator to make it work.

Now is no time to rest, as now it's time to prepare for our next operating event. The Red River Bridge War event will commence on July 14, prior to our next club meeting on Tuesday, July 17 at 7:00 PM at the Courthouse and ends on July 22nd.

Again, it is not a contest, so everyone who participates in the event can have some operating fun and go at their own speed. You can work SSB, FM, CW, or digital, whatever you would like to operate. The idea is to have some operating fun. You can assist with putting up antennas as early as 8:00 AM at the Air Force base. **The special 2 x 1 callsign - W5I** will again be used. The operating event officially starts on July 14th at 9:00 AM until about 4:00 PM at Perrin AFB Museum, 436 McCullum Ave., Denison, TX, 75020. The event will continue to run for the next week, as participants of the club can operate the event from home, using the W5I callsign. Remember, you can only work frequencies that are supported by your personal license class. It is advised that an accurate log be kept and then sent to Lee - N5SLY after the event.

Everyone is invited to come to the next meeting and compare notes on both events, Field Day and The Red River Bridge War event. Hopefully, we may have more news on the Bike Rally that is targeted for August 11. In October, we have the Eisenhower Special Event, and more fun using the W5I call.

The Club 'Rent-a-Radio' will also be available for all events, so you can come out and use this radio to prove to yourself that you learned on how to operate the radio from attending Lee's class. The radio was used at Field Day this year, and it works great.

Dues and Donations

GCARC, ARES, and SKYWARN Patches

GCARC club patches are available and may be purchased at each club meeting; cost is \$5.00 each. These are round patches with the club logo, and are great for wearing on vests and other non-club clothing, placing on equipment bags, go-kits, etc.

ARES and SKYWARN patches may also be purchased at each club meeting; cost is \$4.00 each. If you choose to wear patches on your club shirt or jacket, we recommend ARES members place the ARES patch first on the right shoulder and any other patch (SKYWARN, RACES, CERT, etc.) should go below it. Since some members have tactical shirts with pen pockets on the left sleeve we do not recommend placing any patches on that side.

Several times each year, members have the opportunity to purchase club-related clothing (shirts, caps, jackets, etc.). These items have the GCARC logo and the member's name and callsign embroidered on them. An order form with instructions will be included in the newsletter each time orders are being taken.

VP & QSL Managers Message

This is my 2nd message regarding our Special Events. Next month we'll host the Red River Bridge War Special Event using the W5I call sign. So what is so special about our special events? Good question.

The Red River Bridge War we are commemorating happened right here in Grayson County back in 1931. You can read all about it by visiting...www.qrz.com/db/w5i.

It's not the first time one state had a dispute with another state, or county. Here are some other not so well known disputes you may find interesting....

As you can see disputes happen all the time and folks get seriously upset about them. As far as I can tell only one person was slightly injured in all of these "Wars"...although hundreds and, sometimes, thousands of folks were involved in them.

So how is this event connected to our other Special Events? The Red River Bridge War apparently made national headlines and Adolph Hitler apparently believed that this was evidence that the folks in the United States were fighting among themselves and wouldn't be a problem for his future plans. Well...he got that wrong. Our recently concluded Special Event for Perrin Field commemorated the folks that served there during WW2 and beyond. Many of those that learned to fly at Perrin Field went over to Europe and helped defeat Hitler. And coming in October is our next Special Event celebrating the birthday of Dwight Eisenhower. Don't think I need to say any more.

Amateur Radio will teach you more than just radio stuff. You'll also learn about geography and history. Get involved and start learning.

So how did we do during the Perrin Field Special Event? We had 578 QSO's and have received 257 QSL's, so far, via eQSL.com. 21 different countries contacted and confirmed. Most contacts were made using digital modes...followed by CW...and a few using phone. We really do need more folks to get on the air using the HF bands to do more in the future. I think it is safe to say that those of us that did participate had loads of fun making contacts during this event.

Field Day is coming up...another opportunity to get on the air and make some contacts. Hope you can join us out at the Sherman Municipal Airport and get on the air.

I'll also be conducting another session of the Ham 101 class during Field Day. The class will start at 1 PM on Saturday at the Terminal Building at the airport. If you missed the first class this is your chance to attend. Right after this class you'll know enough to get right on the radio and make some contacts for the club during Field Day. Right after Field Day there is another very fun Special Event to participate in during the 4th of July week....the 13 Colonies Special Event. Contact stations in each of the original 13 colonies to get a clean sweep. There are also 2 bonus stations...one in Philadelphia and one in England. It's a challenge to get them all, but a lot of fun. They have very nice QSL cards and a certificate you can get also. Visit http://www.13colonies.net/for more information.

Lots of things going on as usual in amateur radio. Have fun doing what you enjoy in the hobby.

CW Corner

The year is literally half gone and the club is stepping through the club events. It's hard to imagine for me that the 4th of July is just around the corner. Still, we can reflect on or accomplishments so far this year. The Perrin Field Event seemed like it happened yesterday, but since then Hamcom in Plano Texas roared by, and Field Day is already in our memories for 2018. It's nice to reflect on our accomplishments, but it is equally important to focus on what is in front of us. As far as the upcoming events, the 3rd operating event of the year will take place, known as the Red River Bridge War event before our next general meeting. Details can be found on the W5I page at QRZ.com, the Grayson County Amateur Radio club website and the July 2018 QST page 97. Using the call of W5I, it will be another fun event to work. I'm hoping to have a go-kit assembled by then so I wouldn't have to tear down my home station yet again for a club sponsored event. As if the newsletter and the website wasn't enough to do every month, I've decided to also get geared up to work CW contests once again. The 1 X 1 call is perfect for CW contests and I plan to use it more often when available. A few members of the club have expressed their interest in getting involved in contesting using the mode of CW, so hopefully I can make some time in my very busy week to actually work a contest. It would be wonderful if a few members of the club volunteered to help me work a CW contest. My dream would be to get a group of people going that could run CW contests backed by the GCARC. There are actually 19 ARRL sponsored Contests each year, but the one CW contest that I will be working is the ARRL Sweepstakes – CW Contest which takes place this year from November 3 through November 5. Obviously, I'm not going to be able to work the contest for that entire time, as it was confirmed during Field Day that it was impossible for me to work continuously for a 24 hour period without rest. I promised myself that I would stay up all night, but instead I crashed around 2 AM for a few hours. A few hours wasted in a contest could mean the difference in making the top 10, or can drop you out of the top 25. Most contesters are persistent and will work it through the end. Next year, I plan to work the CQ Worldwide WPX/CW contest which happens on the last full weekend in May. The CQ Worldwide WPX/SSB contest happens the last full weekend in March and next to Field Day it's really fun to work, except you have the added suspense of it being an actual contest.



For approximately 3 weeks now, the club website has a new webpage to buy and sell equipment. Presently, you must log into the website to be able to post ads. There are a few glitches so please be patient. The webpages are available to anyone who happens to be a club member or not, but the only stipulation is that you must register on the website and within the application to be able to post and read ads.

The Ham-Ads web-pages can be found under the GCARC heading at the top of the homepage.

The rules to post are as follows:

- 1) You DO NOT have be a member of the Grayson County Amateur Radio Club to post.
- 2) You must be registered on the website. Note** <u>Your Callsign is ALWAYS</u> <u>your login name</u>. Non-hams cannot post on this site.
- 3) Posts can only last for 30 days, and after that, they will be automatically removed. You will be notified of pending ad deletion a week prior to actual deletion. If you still would like the item to stay posted after 30 days, you will have to re-post the item or items again.
- 4) Once an item is sold, please remove your ad or advise the Admin James at kw5cw@k5gcc.org that your equipment was sold. Only items still available can be listed.

W1AW Operating Schedule

For some members of the club that would like to give CW a try and brush up on their receiving skills, the Amateur Radio Flagship station known as W1AW broadcasts <u>practice CW transmissions</u> on 1.8025, 3.5815, 7.0475, 14.0475, 18.0975, 21.0675, 50.350 and 147.555 MHZ. There are two types of transmissions, known as SLOW CODE and FAST CODE. The speeds for each type are listed immediately below, and the types overlap a little.

SLOW CODE = practice sent at 5, 7.5, 10, 13, and 15 WPM. FAST CODE = practice sent at 35, 30, 25, 20, 15, 13, and 10 WPM.

You can qualify for a W1AW CW certificate or and endorsement if you already have a certificate. Details and prices of either can be found in the July 2018 edition of QST page 101.

There are <u>digital transmissions from W1AW</u> on the following frequencies..

3.5975, 7.095, 14.095, 18.1025, 21.095, 28.095, 50.350, and 147.555 MHZ.

Bulletins are sent using 45.45-baud Baudot, PSK31 in BPSK mode, and MFSK16 on a daily revolving schedule.

W1AW Voice transmissions can be found on the following frequencies..

1.855, 3.99, 7.29, 14.29, 18.16, 21.39, 28.59, 50.350, and 147.555 MHZ.
