The President's QSO

This may be the most important newsletter in the history of the Grayson County Amateur Radio Club. The future of the club is in jeopardy if we do not take action. We need members to show up at club meetings in order to conduct business. I will explain what took place at the April club meeting in this edition of the President's QSO written this month by vice-president Roy Reed, AF5VA.

The April meeting of the GCARC was called to order by President Andrew Bentley, KG5SKM. The club currently has 31 paid members. According to the club's bylaws, we must have one third of eligible members present in order to have a quorum. That means that we would need 11 members present in order to conduct business. We only had 8 members present. This means that we cannot conduct business essential to the continued operation of the club. I read a section of state law that appears to give us the ability to go ahead and conduct business absent the quorum set forth in our bylaws. A lively debate ensued that resulted in two club members walking out. The meeting, or lack thereof, was adjourned. We cannot let this type of thing fracture the club. We all have things going on in our lives but we have members that pay their dues and do not attend a single meeting all year. We certainly appreciate and need the financial support. We also need your vote at club meetings to approve our finances, projects, events, and so forth. Not only is our attendance down at meetings, our membership is down roughly 33 percent this year.

We have a great club and we can work together to right the ship. The way I see it, we have two options. Option one is that we can encourage each other to attend meetings and have a quorum present at each meeting. The other option is to amend the bylaws to make it easier to have a quorum. There is a catch 22 with that option. We have to get enough eligible members to attend a meeting in order to vote to change the bylaws! Let's work together on option one and fill the seats on the third Tuesday each month to begin to grow this club and advance the hobby that we all love.

We have a great presentation planned for the May meeting. Trevor, KG5BFI, will be teaching the Stop the Bleed course. May is Stop the Bleed month and it is a skill that we should all know. Most of our club members also support ARES with Skywarn activities. If, God forbid, a tornado or other disaster were to hit we would likely be the first on scene. Taking this course could give you the added skill needed to save a life. Please make plans to attend the May meeting.

I encourage you to bring a non-ham friend in hopes that we can interest them in becoming a ham. In the meantime, we have asked our treasurer and webmaster James Frank, KW5CW, to post two questions to the website. The first question is "Why do you not attend club meetings?". The second is "What would get you to attend the club meetings?". I encourage you to look for these questions on the website and answer them. This will help us in serving you. I sincerely look forward to seeing you at the next club meeting on Tuesday, May 21st at 19:00 hours in the second-floor assembly room at the Grayson County Courthouse.

Dues and Donations

GCARC, ARES, and SKYWARN Patches

GCARC club patches are available and may be purchased at each club meeting; cost is \$5.00 each. These are round patches with the club logo, and are great for wearing on vests and other non-club clothing, placing on equipment bags, go-kits, etc.

ARES and SKYWARN patches may also be purchased at each club meeting; cost is \$4.00 each. If you choose to wear patches on your club shirt or jacket, we recommend ARES members place the ARES patch first on the right shoulder and any other patch (SKYWARN, RACES, CERT, etc.) should go below it. Since some members have tactical shirts with pen pockets on the left sleeve we do not recommend placing any patches on that side.

Several times each year, members have the opportunity to purchase club-related clothing (shirts, caps, jackets, etc.). These items have the GCARC logo and the member's name and callsign embroidered on them. An order form with instructions will be included in the newsletter each time orders are being taken.

The WC5GC-R EchoLink Node



Recent events made me realize that it has been over four years since we last said anything about the WC5GC-R EchoLink node, so I thought I would share a little bit of information about it.

This node has been active since 2010 to help us communicate with the National Weather Service office in Fort Worth during severe weather. That is its primary function and the reason that it was installed. The node allows the hams at the Weather Service to listen in on our Skywarn Nets during severe weather and provides a much-needed direct communication link. Before this node was installed, we had to rely on a relay station because the Weather Service could not hear us reliably when we were communicating on the 147.00 W5RVT repeater.

The node has two different modes. The first mode is conferencing mode. That means that anyone is able to use the EchoLink node at any time for general Ham Radio use. During severe weather, or anticipated severe weather, we will move the node into Skywarn mode. Skywarn mode is set up so that the WX5FWD radio desk at the National Weather Service can communicate with us and, if necessary, link us into their master system so status updates can be shared with other spotter groups in other counties. Skywarn mode is set up in such a way as to not create a feedback loop in the system. When EchoLink is in Skywarn mode, almost everyone is not allowed to connect so that feedback loop cannot be established. We do have a few remote spotters who do have access to the node during severe weather events so that we have reliable communication with them. These spotters have received special training.

As we experienced last week during our severe weather net, please don't be upset if you hear net control say that they are moving to Skywarn mode and you get disconnected and locked out. What net control is telling you is that we are setting up the link so that our fellow volunteers at the Weather Service in Fort Worth will be able to hear us and a feedback loop can be avoided.

I truly appreciate everyone who has joined our Nets recently here in Grayson County to report the weather in your vicinity. Ground truth provided by ARES storm spotters like you makes a big difference for the decision makers in Fort Worth as well as here in Grayson County.



CW Corner

Information about upcoming operations at The Perrin Field Special event on May 11, 2019

This is your second reminder of the 2nd main GCARC operating event of the year that will take place in approximately 3 weeks. Known as the **Perrin Field Special Event**, it will commence at the Perrin Air Force Base Museum on Saturday, May 11th at 0000z. The address is 436 McCullum Avenue Denison, Texas 75020. Hours of operation at the museum will be from 9 AM until approximately 4 PM when the air base closes for the day. Afterwards, members can operate their own stations at home using the W5I call until the Special Event ends on Sunday, May 19th at 2359z. For those running from home, please remember to stay within your license class band plan for operation. Plans are to provide a special report on the results from the event at the May GCARC Club meeting that commences at the Grayson County Courthouse at 7 PM on Tuesday - May 21st.

In the past, there has been at least two or three stations running during the event. One of the stations set up will be running CW while the others will be running Sideband. Operations will begin with the use of the 1 X 1 call - **W5I**. The frequencies to monitor during the event for the coveted W5I call will be from 7.040 Mhz-7.050 Mhz on 40 meter CW, and from 7.200-7.205 on 40 meter LSB. Digital operations can also take place using the modes of PSK, JT65, JT9 and FT8. Also be aware that the stations will be also running from 14.040 Mhz-14.050 Mhz on 20 meter CW, and from 14.250 Mhz - 14.255 Mhz on 20 meter USB.

A very nice QSL card will be sent to those stations working W5I that send their QSL card with a S.A.S.E.

Some serious operations will take place just one week later, as I - KW5CW will be traveling out-of-state to Kansas to meet Kurt Zoglmann - AD0WE and operate the CQ WorldWide WPX CW contest on the 25th and 26th of May. I also plan to be active during the 400-mile journey to Manhattan Kansas as KW5CW/m, while running CW mobile on 7.045 Mhz, 10.145 Mhz and 14.045 Mhz.


Once in Manhattan Kansas, Kurt and I will be running the CW contest from Kansas State University, using the club call - W0QQQ. It's the club call of the station setup at the college. The antennas to be used are located on the roof of the University. Special QSL cards will be sent to stations that provide an SASE to the University club. The address to send your SASE can be found on QRZ.com. As a little bit extra this time around, I will provide a certificate to those in the Grayson County Amateur Radio club and non-members who actually work W0QQQ during the contest. To acquire it, the qualifier **must attend** a GCARC club meeting to pick up a certificate confirming the contact, whether they are a member of the club or not. It will be the quickest certificate you can earn, as the contact you make with W0QQQ in the contest would average in approximately 10-15 seconds in length. Nothing could make me happier in this contest than if I could work somebody from back home. If you did work the University station during the contest and know for sure that you will be making a club meeting to pick up a certificate, then drop me a line at KW5CW@arrl.net with that fact so that I can confirm your contact with the University station and have your personalized certificate ready for you to receive.

That's it for this month, but while I'm up in Kansas working with Kurt in the CQ CW WPX contest, I will see if I could get a definite commitment from him to write a monthly CW article for the newsletter. I'm sure that you have already read one of his past submitted articles and he is an excellent writer. If you haven't read any of his articles, you can visit his QRZ page of AD0WE and read his excellent work. At the June meeting, I will provide the club with the results of operations for the contest event.

Again, just as a reminder, anyone that works W0QQQ during the contest and can make one of the future GCARC club meetings, will qualify to receive a certificate.

Hurricane Season Letter to Amateur Radio Stations in Hurricane Affected Areas

Hello Fellow Ham Radio Operators,

In cooperation with the National Hurricane Center in Miami, Florida, and WX4NHC, we are asking for your assistance during the Hurricane Season.

The most important role amateur radio plays in hurricanes is to gather and relay information to the National Hurricane Center's Amateur Radio Station WX4NHC.

While there are mechanisms to do this, we are always looking for more assistance in this vital job. You could be the only station in the impacted area and your Eye Witness Reports or measured data, if you have a weather station, could be critical to the forecasters. You could be the only station hearing some other ham calling with a report or needing assistance in a dangerous situation they are in. Also, you could play the important role in translating a Ham's report into a language that we understand.

So, as you can see, everyone has a part they can play.

WX4NHC on 14.325 MHz is a frequency that you should always monitor during a hurricane. More information can be found at www.wx4nhc.org

This frequency is maintained for hurricanes by the Hurricane Watch Net www.hwn.org

The VoIP Hurricane Net utilizes Echolink and IRLP to link stations together over the internet. When HF propagation is not good, sometimes this is the only way information reaches WX4NHC.

EchoLink Conference Room is WX-Talk (Node 7203) and IRLP Node is 9219.
