GCARC, ARES, and SKYWARN Patches

GCARC club patches are available and may be purchased at each club meeting; cost is \$5.00 each. These are round patches with the club logo, and are great for wearing on vests and other non-club clothing, placing on equipment bags, go-kits, etc. ARES and SKYWARN patches may also be purchased at each club meeting; cost is \$4.00 each. If you choose to wear patches on your club shirt or jacket, we recommend ARES members place the ARES patch first on the right shoulder and any other patch (SKYWARN, RACES, CERT, etc.) should go below it. Since some members have tactical shirts with pen pockets on the left sleeve we do not recommend placing any patches on that side.

October SET and some cold weather/Autumn reminders

We dusted off a really old emergency plan from the late 1960s or early 1970s for our Fall Simulated Emergency Test on October 5th. The plan was to go to various government facilities in Grayson County and simulate emergency traffic. We modified the plan to go to the various Post Offices in Grayson County and transmit simplex. This drill gave us some very interesting information as we logged who we could hear directly and who we couldn't. Relays are going to be a necessity if we ever have to move messages across the county or into the surrounding areas via simplex. We used 146.460 MHz simplex for this test since it does not get a lot of use around here. I would like to thank the club members who participated in the SET -- both from the Club booth in Denison or from the various Post Offices before going down to the booth in Denison for a shift.

We are getting close to the time when we need to set our clocks back on Sunday, November 3rd. Please don't forget this is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors, emergency flashlights, change out your clothing, food, and water in your Go Kits. With colder weather on the way, it's also a good time to check the anti-freeze in your cars and make sure you have some warm clothes or blankets (or both) in your car in case you're caught out in some winter weather.

Looking ahead to February -- our Skywarn training will be held on Thursday, February 20 from 6-9pm at the Grayson College Center for Workplace Learning Auditorium in Denison. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend.

QSL Managers Message

Two topics this month. First I want to talk about my Reflections from the Past and then I'll have a final report about our Eisenhower Birthday Special Event.







Another guest operator is Kerry Lynn Wright, KB3WAV

CW CLASSES – James KW5CW



My apologies go out to everyone who have been patiently waiting for CW classes to start. I've taken on more than I can chew it seems when it comes to the CW classes, because I haven't had the time with all the personal stuff going on with my family to be able to get the classes started in the last several months besides a logistics issue that I haven't had any real time to address. I've been in New Orleans for at least a week and returned after my great niece was born on October 2nd. Her name is **Alina Isabella Mendoza** and here she is. I am a very proud great Uncle. I'll just bet at this moment she is thinking about learning CW when she gets older!!



The logistics issue involved the tentative classes at local colleges. I've had issues trying to find a place for a weekly 2 day class. My goal was to get a day during the week set up at the colleges besides a weekend class, but that's not feasible with class availability during the week at the schools. So I will eventually arrange it for a one day per week class on Saturday at the colleges, but it will have to be extended to instead of 6-7 weeks, most likely it will be a 10 week course. If there are classes to be held now at either school, whether it be Grayson County in Denison, or Collin County College in McKinney. The classes will have to wait until 2020 since the holiday season is just about upon us. In the meantime, study assignments and homework via an online course is being setup and will be sent via email or links setup online. Only students signed up for the online course would receive it.

I will be contacting all people who showed interest in the classes at the colleges and they will be able to signup for the online course. Amateurs from three different clubs, the Richardson ARC, the McKinney ARC and the Grayson County ARC have shown interest. All members from each club will be contacted via email so that all members have an opportunity to learn CW. As previously mentioned for the classroom course, the \$20 fee would still apply to the online course. If the course is not completed, the \$20 refund will be donated to a radio club of choice. One advantage for taking the online course is that students could easily schedule time for studies and the course could be taken day or night, any day of the week at the students' discretion.

A new signup form will be sent via email will be sent shortly to all who expressed interest in a online - CW course.
