## GCARC, ARES, and SKYWARN Patches

## CW CLASSES (Update) – James KW5CW



Regarding the CW classes that I wanted to provide for the area, it is obvious to everyone by now that I could not come up with a public place to hold classes twice a week, which was a prerequisite for the curriculum that I created for the CW course. One may ask why it would be so necessary to hold classes twice a week for a CW course, where all you must learn is 26 characters of the alphabet and a few special ones like the period, comma, question mark, etc.

Just ask others who tried to learn CW on their own, and listen to what they have to say.

I have only been able to acquire space at the local colleges for a weekend class. So I've checked out a few more options, and the best I can come up with would be an online course that could be available for everyone. For a 2 day per week class to really work, students would have to attend both classes each week, and not everyone interested in taking a class can put aside the two days picked for the class as they may have other things going on those days. Case in point, if I picked Wednesdays and Saturdays, some prospective students would not be able to attend on Wednesdays, and others may have other activities scheduled with the family on Saturdays. So two days each week is not practical.

So instead of a classroom course, I've decided to modify the existing course to an online course. That way you can go to the online course whenever you have the time. No excuses. During the January meeting, I will give a status update and make known when the online course will become available. If there is allot of interest in the course, I will also add an intermediate and advanced courses. With an online course, you could get to it on your own time schedule, on the day and time you actually have the time.

Again, my apologies go out to everyone who have been patiently waiting for CW classes to start. In January 2020, I should have an update as to when the on-line class will be available.
