# Note regarding State Mandated Orders from Governor Abbott concerning Covid-19

Governor Greg Abbott has issued <u>Executive Order 29</u> on July 2, 2020 requiring all Texans to wear a face covering over the nose and mouth in public spaces, with few exceptions, in counties with 20 or more positive COVID-19 cases. Open Texas checklists are now updated consistent with this order. <u>As of October 13, 2020, businesses may operate up to 75% capacity, effective on October 14, 2020.</u>

The Governor also issued a <u>proclamation</u> giving mayors and county judges the ability to impose restrictions on some outdoor gatherings of over 10.
