# **QSL Managers Message**

# **Filters**

What are filters? Filters remove stuff we don't want. In your car you have Air Filters, Gas Filters, and Oil Filters. They remove dirt which would hurt your car.

Your radio has filters too. The filters on your radio remove sounds you don't want to hear. Common filters found on radios include...

NB – Noise Blanker. Removes the sound of spark plugs firing in your vehicle when the engine is running. This filter can be turned On when needed and is usually Off.


NR – Noise Reduction. Reduces overall background noise. This filter can be turned On when needed and is usually Off.

**Notch**. Reduces or removes noise close to the frequency you are on. I find this very useful to remove the tone when another station tunes up on the frequency your on. This filter can be turned On when needed and is usually Off.


One filter that is always On and can't be turned Off is the Twin PBT – Pass Band Tuning – if you have an Icom radio. It is called DSP – Digital Signal Processor – if you have a Kenwood or Yaesu radio. This filter sets how much you can hear on the radio. It is set differently depending on what Mode you are using. Here are some examples...











The images above are the waterfall of the USB of my lcom 7300 radio. The upper side band is 3000 Hz wide. You can see that the widest signal is heard when FlL1 is selected. The signal is narrower when FlL2 or FlL3 are selected. You can manually adjust these filters...you can adjust the upper and lower settings and move the whole filter from left to right. These images are the default settings on my radio.

How you set these filters on your radio is just personal preference.

For me I do SSB – Phone and DIG – Digital Modes. I always use FIL1. When doing Phone Modes voices just sound better to me using FIL1. FIL2 makes voices sound a little funny and FIL3 makes it very difficult to understand the other station. When doing Digital Modes the software I use will filter out all of the stations except the one I want to have a QSO with. Therefore, I want to use FIL1 to ensure that I'm hearing everyone that is on frequency.

James, KW5CW, can tell you all about CW, but as you can see, you can set the filter to only hear a small portion of the SSB signal. This will make it much easier to hear only the station you want to have a QSO with.

You should also realize by now that setting the Twin PBT, or DSP filter incorrectly can make it impossible for you to hear what you want on the radio.

It is important that you learn how to use all these filters on your radio. I hope that you'll find this information useful.





# **Special Interest Groups Update for January 2023**

Antenna Group - The antenna group will have its first meeting in February of 2023. The tentative date is Wednesday February 1, 2023, only two days after Winter Field Day. The topic at the meeting will be discussed at the next general meeting, but suggestions are: Magnetic Loop Antennas, both homebrew and commercial, continued discussions on end-fed antennas, dipoles, or any type of wire antenna, quad antennas, or beam antennas. Another note will be sent to all previously interested group members that may be interested in continuing with the antenna group. A HamClubOnline notice will be sent out to all members of the club inviting them to attend. If you are interested in attending, please send a return note to antennagroup@graysoncountyarc.org specifying what type of antenna you want to learn about at the next antenna group meeting. Previously, I wanted to have an antenna group session on magnetic loop antennas, as this is my preference, but I'm open to suggestions. I have a motorized Chameleon magnetic loop antenna and a homebrew loop antenna to show that I'll be using at Winter Field Day and can hold a class on magnetic loops just a few days later at the Sherman Municipal Airport. Both antennas will be displayed at the Antenna Group meeting at the Sherman Municipal Airport on Dewey Street in Sherman from 7:00 PM to 9:30PM on Wednesday - February 1, 2023 only if the membership wants to see them and learn a little theory about magnetic loop antennas.

The **Solar Group** will be scheduling a meeting soon. In the meantime, keep a lookout for Jim's solar setup at Winter Field Day. If you are interested in Solar, Jim - KI5BMN would answer any questions you have about this method of charging batteries at WFD.

Updates from the **POTA Group** will be provided by Lee – N5SLY when available. But for anyone interested in POTA (Parks-on-the-Air), there will be a park activation during Winter Field Day. Lee will demonstrate how to make POTA contacts using sideband and the digital modes. He is always willing to mentor others in the subject of POTA. Lee most always mentions his activations at parks on the GCARC Facebook page as they occur.
