# **QSL Managers Message**

### **DX Code of Conduct**

Some good advice about being a good ham operator...




# DX Code of Conduct

- I will listen, and listen, and then listen again before calling.
- I will only call if I can copy the DX station properly.
- I will not trust the DX cluster and will be sure of the DX station's call sign before calling.
- I will not interfere with the DX station nor anyone calling and will never tune up on the DX frequency or in the QSX slot.
- I will wait for the DX station to end a contact before I call.
- I will always send my full call sign.
- I will call and then listen for a reasonable interval. I will not call continuously.
- I will not transmit when the DX operator calls another call sign, not mine.
- I will not transmit when the DX operator queries a call sign not like mine.
- I will not transmit when the DX station requests geographic areas other than mine.
- When the DX operator calls me, I will not repeat my call sign unless I think he has copied it incorrectly.
- I will be thankful if and when I do make a contact.
- I will respect my fellow hams and conduct myself so as to earn their respect.

### What time is it?

Many folks get confused about time and how it can affect things. Hams all over the world make contacts on the radio and want to get their contacts confirmed to prove they contacted another station. However, time is different all over the world. When it is 5 PM here it is 10 AM somewhere else and Midnight in another place of the world.



To get a confirmation of a contact made the times of both stations have to be the same. So how is this problem fixed?

Easy...

Hams use...

**UTC.** Coordinated Universal Time

GMT, Greenwich Mean Time or

**Zulu** Time, Military time so everyone is using the same clock.

UTC, GMT and Zulu all mean the exact same thing so it doesn't matter which term you use. The only important thing is that you use this time when you are playing on the radio.

UTC, GMT and Zulu time is the time it is in Greenwich, England right now. Depending on where you are in the world, local time may be as much as +12 hours or -12 hours different than it is in Greenwich.

You can get an App for your phone that will tell you what time it is using **UTC**, **GMT** or **Zulu** time. Your computer clock can be adjusted for these times too as well as your logging program that you use.

# What did you say?

Accurately communicating information over the radio is very important. But it can be a real problem. You can contact operators from all over the world, and although English is the standard language for Ham Radio, the operators accent can make it very difficult to accurately copy important information.

So how is this problem overcome? By using the Phonetic Alphabet.

You should learn to use the Phonetic Alphabet to help accurately copy information when you are using your radio. It is especially useful to copy the Call Sign of the other station accurately.
