New Business:

QSL Managers Message The Green Wire


The Green Wire is commonly referred to as the Ground Wire. We ground our radio equipment for several reasons...

- 1. Electrical safety
- 2. To prevent stray RF exposure
- 3. Lightning protection

Also, some of the antennas that we use need to be grounded.

I'm the first one to admit that I don't know a lot about how radio waves work. All I know is that my station at home, works well as does the station I use when I am mobile. Both stations have grounding that seems to work just fine. I grounded my equipment, and it appears that I did it correctly...by accident...because I really didn't know what I was doing.

At home the first thing you want to do is check that your AC outlets are working correctly. Depending on how old your house is you'll be using one of these electrical outlets...





You can use this to check that the outlets are wired correctly...



This step makes sure your station is electrically safe...#1 above.

The next thing you should do is run a ground wire from each piece of equipment to a common ground buss bar. We do this to ensure that we don't have a "floating" ground between different pieces of equipment. This will ensure that you are protected from stray RF exposure...#2 above.

Next, you should run a ground wire from your ground buss bar to a ground rod outside your house. Your tower should also be grounded to the ground rod. You do this for lightning protection...#3 above.

And last, we get to the antenna. Dipoles use one side for the signal and one side for the ground. So, you don't have to ground them. Some vertical antennas need ground radials to work, and some don't. Some vertical antennas just use the earth as their ground.

My mobile antenna is a vertical and it uses the car body for a reflective ground surface. It is also capacitively coupled to the earth for a ground. The tires are the insulator between the car and the earth.

When I'm operating mobile I'm not worried about AC electrical safety or lightning because I'm using a battery for my power source and I'm not going to operate my equipment when there is lightning close by. So the only thing I'm going to do is #2 above. My antenna doesn't need any special grounding according to the manufacturer and my attempts to add grounding to the antenna made no difference in its performance.
