The GCARC Club Trailer

In 2024, the club purchased it's first ever club trailer. It's purpose is to help take GCARC Ham Radio operating activities mobile to different venues in order to promote amateur radio and the club and to simply have FUN!. In 2024, members of the club spent at least 3 different days to begin to give it a complete face over inside and out. The work is still not done, as the workers have only had a short time to complete the work that must be done. If you feel you have some great ideas that we should incorporate in the trailer and have some time to help, please participate in helping to convert the trailer to our needs. The project is going much slower than we had hoped, but we hope to have the trailer available for Winter Field Day this year, for those who would like to work on it. The original inside wood sheets were pulled down from the walls, and foam insulation was installed before reinstalling the wood sheets. We have a table ready to be installed to create an operating position for operators and we want to install lighting in the ceiling. We plan to create a storage area for bins at one end and we will have power channels coming in from the outside to power radios and charging circuits for recharging batteries. We will also set it up air conditioning and heating when necessary.

A special thanks go to **Joe Hayes - KJ5BFD** who has provided his location for the re-build of the trailer. Joe Hayes has recently gone through Knee Replacement Surgery, so the Club wishes him a speedy recovery and thanks him for everything he has done for the club. Without Joe, the club would not have this trailer. For many, this trailer has only been a dream, but Joe made it a reality.

Soon in the final stages, the electrical work will be completed and the club can then use the trailer as intended. Again, it has been a slow process, but persistence and help from club members willing to give up a good part of a day to help with the re-build is helping make our future dream a reality.
