National Preparedness Month and SDR Presentation at September Meeting

As the year moves on, the GCARC stays in tune with the needs of its members and the community especially in National Preparedness Month in September. It is the time to revisit your ability to provide important things for yourself and family in case of an emergency to make sure you are not without in these modern times. We usually visit this topic every year, and the next meeting should be a special treat for everyone to witness. Details about basic use of radio for preparedness, repeater linked systems, first aid kits, and even a little about self defense for the ladies are on the agenda. It's all part of what should be in your know-how wheel-house of knowledge to stay safe in the crazy days of 2025 and in the future. That will be the serious side of the discussion.

On the fun side of the discussion, **Software Defined Radio**, otherwise known as **SDR**, will be a topic to be discussed if time permits. Software designed to work on your computer with your ham radio gives you the ability to travel a wide spectrum of frequencies and control your radio with a computer using very popular device known as SDRPlay. Amateurs use different programs to accomplish different things using SDR, and two of these programs are 'SDR Connect' and 'SDR Console'.

SDR Connect allows you to scan and monitor the entire radio frequency spectrum with a band scope on your PC monitor and all services that are not scrambled for privacy. SDR Console allows control of a radio from a computer, such as changing frequencies, modes, setting filters, while using a band scope of your radio on your PC. Your computer becomes your radio receiver. There is no need for your radio receiver when you have a PC running SDR Console or SDR Connect software.

It's important for you to attend the meeting if you want to hear all about these topics concerning **National Preparedness Month** and **Software Defined Radio**.

Amateur Radio License Exam Requirement at September 16th meeting

September 16 at 6:00PM - Amateur Radio License Testing Requirements before Attending the Test Session

Goto the following URL to register with the FCC and apply for an FRN before arriving to take your test at 6PM prior to the general club meeting:

COmmission REgistration System for the FCC | Federal Communications Commission

Access CORES: Go to the link - FCC's Registration System (CORES).. Register for an account. If you don't have one: Follow the prompts to create a username and password. Register for a new FRN. Choose Individual or Entity, then provide the required information. Complete the registration form, including contact information and, if applicable, your taxpayer identification number (TIN). Your FRN number will go to your email. YOU NEED TO ACQUIRE THIS FRN BEFORE YOU WILL BE ABLE TO TAKE A TEST. If you already have an FRN, bring it with you to your exam session.

WC5GC (UHF): 442.875(+) MHz, 100.0 PL (Link to W5RVT 147.00 during Skywarn)

Note: There is no courtesy tone on this repeater. For testing your radio, arrange for someone to meet you on this repeater when it's not linked. If all repeaters fail, we will move to 146.52 simplex and then move as necessary to other simplex frequencies depending upon the situation.
